## Since 1896...

The King's Daughters are the founders of Children's Hospital of The King's Daughters. We have more than 120 years of fascinating history of caring for children beginning with hiring a bicycle nurse, to opening a clinic, to building a modern stand-alone pediatric hospital. We have been making a difference in the lives of children in Hampton Roads since 1896.



The King's Daughters membership is organized into circles (Adult and Junior) that are located throughout Hampton Roads. Each Circle elects its own leaders, organizes its own events, contributes hand-sewn items and donates time and money to CHKD. Members also chair and serve on The King's Daughters' major fundraising projects throughout the year. A Board of Directors which governs the organization is elected annually by the membership and is supported by a dedicated staff.

Children's Hospital of The King's Daughters Health System (CHS) is dedicated exclusively to meeting the unique medical and surgical needs of children, both inpatient and outpatient, throughout Virginia and northeastern North Carolina. Facilities include the Children's Hospital of The King's Daughters as well as a comprehensive network of pediatric providers who work in locations throughout our community.





## The King's Daughters: Year in Review

The history of our King's Daughters organization is a long and venerable one that continues to thrive. As our integrated health system expands into new roles within our community, we are called to be champions of the cause. We aim to "promote superior pediatric wellness," by providing funds and advocacy that will provide disease prevention, research and interventional initiatives, as well as providing state-of-the-art equipment and innovative programs, for the children of our community.

### Community

The King's Daughters continue to focus their attention and energy toward providing superior health care for the children of our community. Through countless volunteer hours in excess of 54,000 and extreme dedication, we are so fortunate to have a diverse membership that brims with creativity, passion, and innovation. Our volunteer activities are needed just as much today as they were more than 100 years ago. Our priority remains the same; CHILDREN.

The King's Daughters' Corporate Advisory Board thrived after completing its first year; this board enabled The King's Daughters to actively involve key leaders in the community who provided valuable insight and recommendations for our major events. Members of the Advisory Board included:

### The King's Daughters Office

The four-member staff: Lisa Coleman, Executive Director; Season Roberts, Development Operations Manager; Natalie Carducci, Membership Coordinator; and Amanda Bohannon, Department Secretary worked tirelessly with all King's Daughters' current and prospective members, CHKD employees and the community at large to ensure the continuation of The King's Daughters' legacy; that goals were met and exceeded. The King's Daughters' Staff were active members and participated with Hampton Roads Chamber of Commerce, Downtown Norfolk Council, Association of Fundraising Professionals, and Virginia Association of Healthcare Auxiliaries and



Volunteers, American Fundraising Professionals, Volunteer Hampton Roads and the Ghent Business Association. The King's Daughters' administrative staff is a highly motivated and organized team.

### CHKD Endowment and Capital Campaign Completion

The King's Daughters were proud to announce the completion of a five-year \$1 million pledge to CHKD's Endowment Campaign to two vital programs; Nursing Scholarships and the CHKD Child Abuse Center. We were equally proud to announce that we accomplished this with 100% participation from our Circles.

The King's Daughters pledged \$250,000 to the CHKD Virginia Beach Health and Surgery Center. The King's Daughters, as well as many of our sponsors and supporters are all prominently recognized in the lobby of CHKD Norfolk as part of the new recognition wall.

### The Internet and Social Media

Our web presence continued to grow stronger with our King's Daughters' website [www.kingsdaughters.org](http://www.kingsdaughters.org) and [facebook.com](http://facebook.com). Our now well established fan page, a group page, and a cause page has over 4,300 members, and \$1,000 was raised from our cause page alone. The monthly newsletter, The Circular, continues to be emailed to 80% of our members. Our website, Circle pages, and KD E-Blasts have become our main source of communication and an effective way for our organization to not only connect with the members but enable us to share with our community, CHKD employees, and the public at large the exciting projects that our membership constantly strives to create. All King's Daughters were sent a special "Thank You" e-card during National Volunteers Week in April for their invaluable service.



### Membership

We now have 1094 members in 48 Adult Circles and 6 Junior Circles. We welcomed four new Circles that were formed in the 2009-10 fiscal year; Lafayette River Circle, Oceanfront Circle, Circle in the Sand and Circle in the Bridge.

The 2008-09 King's Daughters' Annual Recognition Meeting was held on October 6th, at the Ohef Shalom Temple in Norfolk. Awards were presented to Circles and members, followed by a memorial service for departed King's Daughters. Taylor Franklin received The King's Daughters' Award of Excellence which is awarded each year to a non-King's Daughter who shows exemplary dedication to our organization.



### KD Connect Meetings

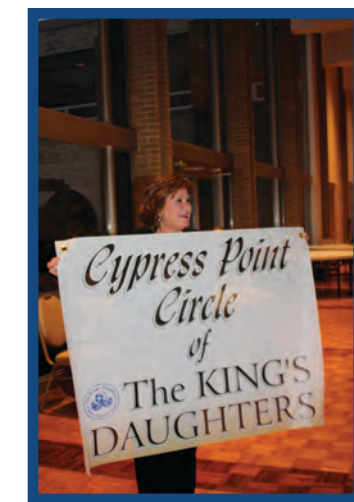
Our KD Connect meetings promote communication between Circles, staff and CHKD. They were held in September, October, January, April, and June. Guest speakers from CHS including Mr. James Dahling addressed the ongoing challenges facing CHKD in these difficult economic times and the strategies being undertaken to maintain the viability of the hospital. The Tudor Family shared their personal experience at CHKD during their son's illness. Circles announced their upcoming projects and events and presented checks to the organization.

### Circle Accomplishments

Circle projects and revenues again reached an all time high. \$326,000 was donated by circles this year. 24,014 pieces of linens, knitted items, sewn items, and gifts were donated. 54,960 volunteer hours were contributed. Adult Leaders and Treasurers attended orientation and training sessions in Norfolk and Hampton in September. Circle members continue to arrange tours and meetings within the hospital, inspiring renewed interest, excitement and enthusiasm for CHKD.

### Junior Circles

Junior Circles continue to excel in providing Adult Circles with energetic volunteers. All junior leaders and treasurers attended a training and orientation meeting in September to help them organize for the year.



**Major Projects**

The King's Daughters' 2009-10 Major Projects consisted of the Holly Festival of Trees, Holly Ball, Tour de Cuisine, and the RunWalk for the Kids.

The 27th Annual Holly Festival of Trees was held at the Norfolk Waterside Marriott Hotel in Downtown Norfolk November 20-21, 2009. The Holly Events kicked off with the unveiling of the holiday windows by Macy's at the Norfolk Waterside Marriott Hotel for the second year. A Luncheon and Fashion Show was held, featuring items from Beverly's Fine Fashions, followed by an evening Gala with Live and Silent Auctions. Children and families enjoyed the holiday tradition of Breakfast with Santa. This year, the Holly Festival of Trees raised \$70,000 for CHKD.

The 47th Annual Holly Ball was held at The Westin, Town Center, Virginia Beach, Saturday, December 5, 2009. This event was attended by King's Daughters, CHKD employees, CHKD specialty groups and by the Hampton Roads' business community and elected officials, including Congressman Glen Nye. The event raised \$50,000 for CHKD.

The 6th Annual Tour de Cuisine reached new heights with a sellout event held in the Meadowbrook area of Norfolk on May 23, 2010. Five families in our community opened their beautiful homes, and five local restaurants donated their culinary creations. Tour de Cuisine continues to be a great success and raised \$25,000.



The 5th Annual RunWalk for the Kids was held on June 19, 2010 at Town Point Park, Norfolk. This 8K Run, 2-mile walk, and 1 Mile Fun Run raised \$110,000 for CHKD with 3,500 participants from in and around the community. The RunWalk attracted families, schools, churches, and businesses alike. Teams again played a pivotal role in participation with more than 150 teams made up of families, friends, businesses and many CHKD employees and patients. CHKD's Sports Medicine headed up a most significant First Aid tent, and CHKD's Team Rehab won an award for the CHKD team with the most participants. More than 85 volunteers from the community came out that day to help make this event fun, educational, and a great success for our hospital.

**Other Fundraisers, Special Projects and Happenings**

In addition to Circle activities and Major Projects, The King's Daughters supported the following special projects:

Caritas Circle, Circle of Friends, North Suffolk Circle, and Lynnhaven Sandpipers' Junior Circle participated in the annual "Let's Make a Scarecrow" Project hosted in conjunction with McDonald Garden Center, October 10 & 11, 2009. This event raised over \$11,000.00

The King's Daughters teamed up once again with the Iguana Surf Club for their annual "Almost a Surf" Contest Competition. Friends and families got together for a fun day on the beach and were later presented with prizes for accomplishments such as "the Best Wipeout!" This event raised \$4,000.



**Thrift Stores**

The King's Daughters continued to support CHKD Thrift Stores through individual donations. The Circle Donation Bag Drive in May generated a total of 5,016 bags full of donations. Each circle collects bags from its members, and totals are calculated by the office. Cypress Point Circle was the winner of this year's Bag Drive with 1,673 bags. Members of The King's Daughters' staff and Board of Directors attended the Thrift Store Managers' annual breakfast to show appreciation for their continued promotion of the canisters as well as the incredible day to day operations of our thrift stores.

**Canisters**

The King's Daughters, with the generous help of local merchants and our own CHKD Thrift Stores, raised an incredible \$240,000 from canister donations this year. Our Canisters are easily identifiable and are an essential form of income to The King's Daughters.

**Advocacy Efforts**

This year our membership advocated for fair and equitable funding at both the state and federal level. The strong grassroots advocacy efforts of The King's Daughters, CHKD employees, physicians and the community at large, was well recognized when Governor Robert McDonnell amended the state budget to restore \$1.8 million in funding to CHKD.

**Annual Contribution to CHKD**

In spite of the economic environment, and because of the tenacious efforts of our members, The King's Daughters were able to donate \$567,000 to CHKD for fiscal year 2009-10. These funds were raised through Circle Projects, Major Projects, Canister Funds, and other sources.

The King's Daughters continued to operate successfully in Fiscal year 2009-10, our second year of operating as a completely self-sustaining corporation, as we no longer received Corporate Support/funding from CHKD.

**In closing...**

Raising friends and funding for Children's Hospital of The King's Daughters has taken on a new meaning this past year. It has reinvigorated those of us who have been a part of this organization for many years and gave greater purpose for those members who have recently joined. The success of The King's Daughters is an example to our Hampton Roads community in volunteer hours, advocacy, fundraising and development of future leaders. On the eve of celebrating the 50th Anniversary of opening the doors of our core facility in Norfolk, we rededicate our commitment of support to Children's Hospital of The King's Daughters.

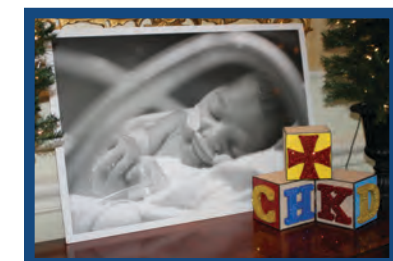

## DONATIONS TO \$1 MILLION KD ENDOWMENT FUND



In 2005, The King's Daughters pledged 1 million dollars to be paid over five years to the CHKD Endowment Funds for the Child Abuse Program and the Nursing Externship Program. In June 2010, the final check was presented to CHKD.

### Advocacy Efforts

The King's Daughters made significant contributions to the Grassroots Legislative Advocacy Program this past year. Due to the diligence and the many visits to our legislators in Richmond, VA, we got the attention of Governor Bob McDonnell. He heard our story and proposed an amendment to the biennial budget to restore \$1.8 million in state funding for the Children's Hospital of The King's Daughters (CHKD), and our legislators accepted it. The state dollars also allow the facility to receive federal Medicaid reimbursement funds of a similar amount.

The outcome reflects the tremendous efforts of so many of our King's Daughters, CHKD employees, various board members and supporters, including the media. We are grateful that Governor McDonnell took this action to restore funding for CHKD. Special acknowledgement goes to our very own Doctor and Senator Ralph Northam and to Delegate Chris Jones for their tireless efforts on our behalf in Richmond. Many King's Daughters wrote letters, made phone calls, and encouraged their family and friends to do the same.

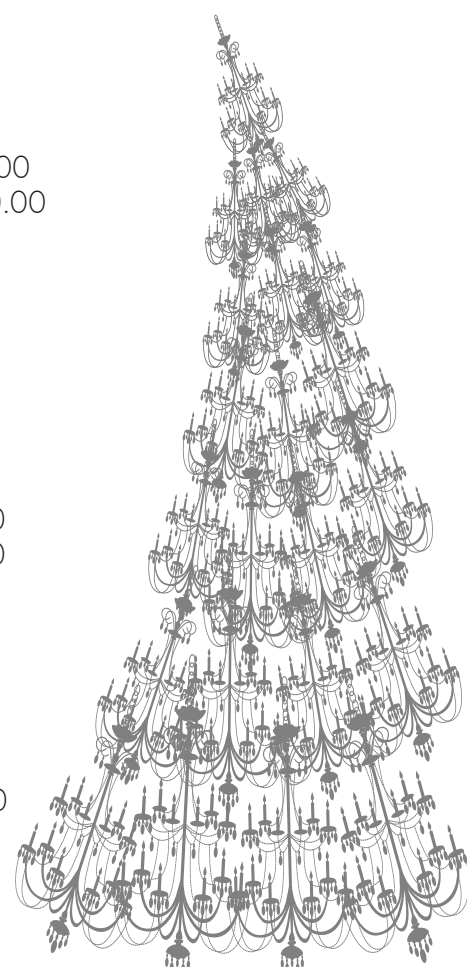
