Since 1896...

The King's Daughters are the founders of Children's Hospital of The King's Daughters (CHKD). We have more than 120 years of fascinating history caring for children beginning with hiring a bicycle nurse, to opening a clinic, to building a modern stand-alone pediatric hospital. We have been making a difference in the lives of children in Hampton Roads since 1896.



The King's Daughters' membership is organized into circles (Adult and Junior) that are located throughout Hampton Roads. Each Circle elects its own leaders, organizes its own events, contributes hand-sewn items and donates time and money to CHKD. Members also chair and serve on The King's Daughters' major fundraising projects throughout the year. A Board of Directors which governs the organization is elected annually by the membership and is supported by a dedicated staff.

Children's Hospital of The King's Daughters Health System (CHS) is dedicated exclusively to meeting the unique medical and surgical needs of children, both inpatient and outpatient, throughout Virginia and northeastern North Carolina. Facilities include the Children's Hospital of The King's Daughters as well as a comprehensive network of pediatric providers who work in locations throughout our community.



The King's Daughters: Year in Review

The history of our King's Daughters organization is a long and venerable one that continues to thrive. As our integrated health system expands into new roles within our community, we are called to be champions of the cause. We aim to "promote superior pediatric wellness," by providing funds and advocacy that will provide disease prevention, research and interventional initiatives, as well as providing state-of-the-art equipment and innovative programs, for the children of our community.

Community

The King's Daughters continue to focus their attention and energy on providing superior health care for the children of our community. Through countless volunteer hours in excess of 54,000 and extreme dedication, we are so fortunate to have a diverse membership that brims with creativity, passion, and innovation. Our volunteer activities are needed just as much today as they were more than 100 years ago. Our priority remains the same: CHILDREN.

The King's Daughters Office

The four-member staff: Lisa Coleman, Executive Director; Season Roberts, Development Operations Manager; Natalie Carducci, Membership Coordinator; and Amanda Bohannon, Department Secretary. They worked tirelessly with all King's Daughters' current and prospective members, CHKD employees and the community at large to ensure the continuation of The King's Daughters' legacy; that goals were met and exceeded. The King's Daughters' Staff were active members and participated with Hampton Roads Chamber of Commerce, Downtown Norfolk Council, Association of Fundraising Professionals, and Virginia Association of Healthcare Auxiliaries and Volunteers, American Fundraising Professionals, Volunteer Hampton Roads and the Ghent Business Association. The King's Daughters' administrative staff is a highly motivated and organized team. In December, Season Roberts left the organization and in June, we welcomed Jen Wilson as she joined the staff as Development Assistant.



CHKD

The King's Daughters continue to contribute toward our pledge of \$250,000 to the CHKD Virginia Beach Health and Surgery Center. The King's Daughters were pleased to pledge \$150,000 toward the purchase of an Aquatic Therapy Pool for CHKD's newest location; The Chesapeake Health Center at Oakbrooke.

Annual Contribution to CHKD

In spite of the economic environment, and because of the tenacious efforts of our members, The King's Daughters were able to donate \$500,000 to CHKD for fiscal year 2010-2011. These funds were raised through Circle Projects, Major Projects, Canister Funds, and other sources.

The King's Daughters continued to operate successfully in Fiscal Year 2010-2011, our third year of operating as a completely self-sustaining corporation, as we no longer received Corporate Support/funding from CHKD.



Thrift Stores

The King's Daughters continued to support CHKD Thrift Stores through individual donations. The Circle Donation Bag Drive in May generated a total of 4,760 bags full of donations with 15 Circles participating. Each circle collects bags from its members, and totals are tallied. Lakewood Circle was the winner of this year's Bag Drive with 1,172 bags. Members of The King's Daughters' staff attended the Thrift Store Managers' annual breakfast to show appreciation for their continued promotion of the canisters as well as the incredible daily operations of our thrift stores.



The Internet and Social Media

Our web presence continued to grow stronger with our King's Daughters' website www.kingsdaughters.org and [facebook.com](https://www.facebook.com/kingsdaughters). Our now well established fan page, and cause page has over 4,400 members, and over \$600 was raised from our cause page alone. The

monthly newsletter, The Circular, continues to be emailed to 80% of our members. Our website, Circle pages, and KD E-Blasts continue to be our main source of communication and an effective way for our organization to connect with the members. They also enable us to share with our community, CHKD employees, and the public at large the exciting projects that our membership constantly strives to create. All King's Daughters were once again sent a special "Thank You" e-card during National Volunteers' Week in April for their invaluable service.

Membership

We now have 1094 members in 48 Adult Circles and 4 Junior Circles. We welcomed one new Adult Circle that was formed in the 2010-2011 fiscal year; Seashell Circle.

KD Connect Meetings

Our KD Connect meetings promote communication between Circles, staff and CHKD. They were held in September, October, January, April, and June. Circles presented numerous checks from individual projects and speakers from within CHKD shared ways in which The King's Daughters could collaborate in Celebrating the 50th anniversary of the hospital.

The 2010-2011 King's Daughters' Annual Recognition Meeting was held on October 15th, at the Norfolk Waterside Sheraton. We welcomed special guest speaker, Governor Robert McDonnell. Awards were presented to Circles and members, followed by a memorial service for departed King's Daughters. Charlie Brenner received The King's Daughters' Award of Excellence which is awarded each year to a non-King's Daughter who shows exemplary dedication to our organization.



Circle Accomplishments

Circle projects and revenues again reached an all time high. Over \$363,000 was donated by Circles this year. Donations included 21,421 pieces of linens, knitted items, sewn items, and gifts were donated. There were 54,335 volunteer hours contributed by our Circle members. Adult Leaders and Treasurers attended orientation and training sessions in Norfolk, Virginia Beach, and Hampton in September. Circle members continue to arrange tours and meetings within the hospital, inspiring renewed interest, excitement and enthusiasm for CHKD.



Junior Circles

Junior Circles continue to excel in providing Adult Circles with energetic volunteers. All junior leaders and treasurers attended a training and orientation meeting in September to help them organize for the year ahead. They held Rock 4 the Kids, battle of the bands in March at the School of Rock in Norfolk. The event was a great success and with a packed house, it raised approximately \$5,500 for CHKD



Major Projects

The King's Daughters' 2010-2011 Major Projects consisted of the Holly Festival of Trees, Holly Ball, Tour de Cuisine, RunWalk for the Kids, and the newly introduced KD Couture.



The 28th Annual Holly Festival of Trees was held at the Princess Anne Country Club in Virginia Beach on November 19-20, 2010. The Holly Events kicked off with the evening Gala, Live and Silent Auctions. Once again, children and families enjoyed the holiday tradition of Breakfast with Santa. This year, the Holly Festival of Trees raised \$70,000 for CHKD.

The 48th Annual Holly Ball was held at The Westin, Town Center, Virginia Beach, Saturday, December 4, 2010. This event was attended by King's Daughters, CHKD employees, CHKD specialty groups and by the Hampton Roads' business community. The event raised \$50,000 for CHKD.



The first ever KD Couture was held on April 1, 2011 at the Norfolk Waterside Marriott. The King's Daughters embarked on a new and fun project. It was a high end New York Fashion Week style fashion show never before seen in Hampton Roads with four 75ft runways, Spring Fashions from Hampton Roads' top boutiques and 24 models. The grand finale was the presentation of two gowns designed by a fashion student at ODU. One of the dresses was auctioned off and the other modeled by a CHKD patient.



The 7th Annual Tour de Cuisine was held in the Jamestown Crescent area of Norfolk on May 23, 2011. Five families in our community opened their beautiful homes, and five local restaurants donated their culinary creations. Tour de Cuisine continues to be a great success and raised \$20,000.

The 6th Annual RunWalk for the Kids was held on June 18, 2011 at Town Point Park, Norfolk. This 8K Run, 2-mile walk, and 1 Mile Fun Run raised \$100,000 for CHKD with 3,100 participants from all over the Hampton Roads community. The RunWalk attracted families, schools, churches, and businesses alike. Teams again played a pivotal role in participation with more than 125 teams made up of families, friends, businesses as well as many CHKD employees and patients. CHKD's Sports Medicine headed up a most significant First Aid tent, CHKD's Team Rehab won an award for the CHKD team with the most participants and Circle in the Bridge of The King's Daughters was the Circle team with the most participants. More than 100 volunteers from the community came out that day to help make this event fun, educational, and a great success for our hospital. The King's Daughters also partnered with CHKD at the RunWalk to celebrate the hospital's milestone at CHKD's 50th Birthday "blocks party". Festivities began immediately after the 1 Mile "Fun Run" with all sorts of family fun.



Other Fundraisers, Special Projects and Happenings

In addition to Circle activities and Major Projects, The King's Daughters supported the following special projects:

Caritas Circle, Circle of Friends, North Suffolk Circle, and Lynnhaven Sandpipers' Junior Circle participated in the annual "Let's Make a Scarecrow" Project hosted in conjunction with McDonald Garden Center, October 9 & 10, 2010. This event raised over \$18,000.00!

The King's Daughters teamed up once again with the Iguana Surf Club for their annual "Almost a Surf" Contest Competition. Friends and families got together for a fun day on the beach and were later presented with prizes for accomplishments such as "the Best Wipeout!" This event raised \$3,000!

Canisters

The King's Daughters, with the generous help of local merchants and our own CHKD Thrift Stores, raised an incredible \$242,700 from canister donations this year. Our Canisters are easily identifiable and are an essential form of income to The King's Daughters.

Advocacy Efforts

This year, once again our membership advocated for our hospital. Eight King's Daughters met personally with legislative officials in Richmond last February to remind them of the needs and importance of supporting bills that advocate better healthcare for the children of our community. The King's Daughters were reminded to contact each of their district's legislators directly to garner their support.

In closing...

Having been a part of our King's Daughters organization for many years it has been both a blessing and a privilege. It has opened leadership opportunities that have enhanced my life personally and professionally. Thank you for allowing me to serve as your President these past two years.



Regardless of when you joined our organization or what role you take on within your Circle you need to understand the impact you make as advocates for "superior pediatric wellness" here in Hampton Roads. KD Award of Excellence

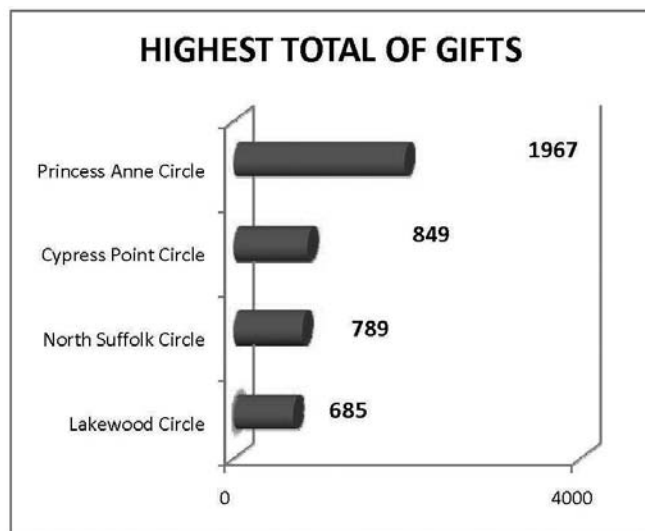
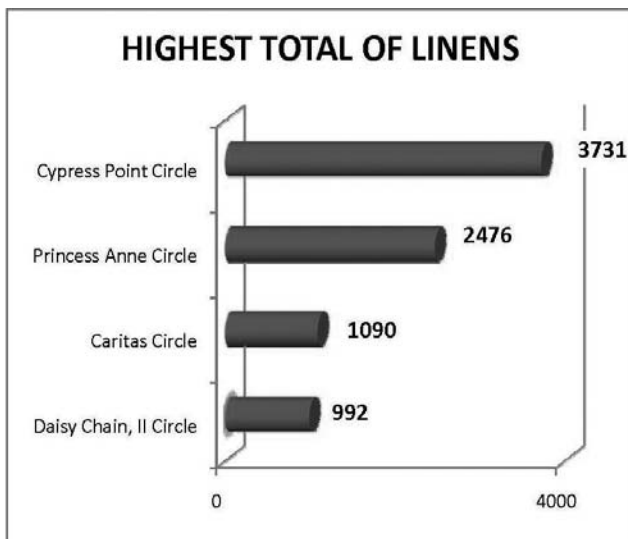
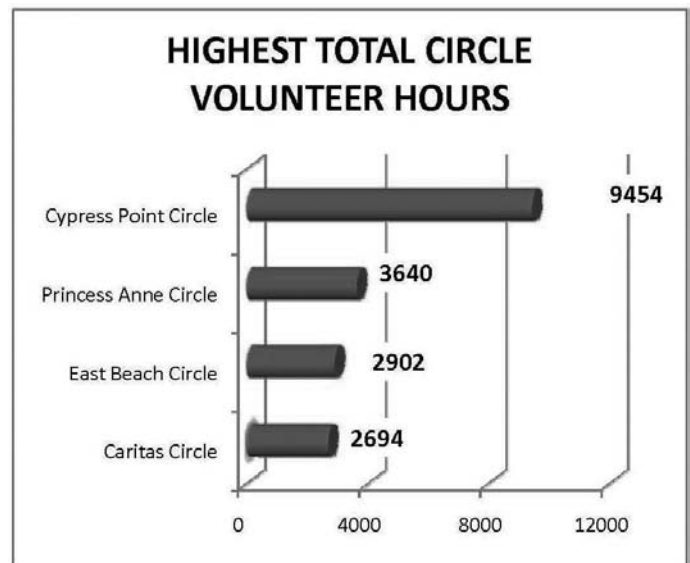

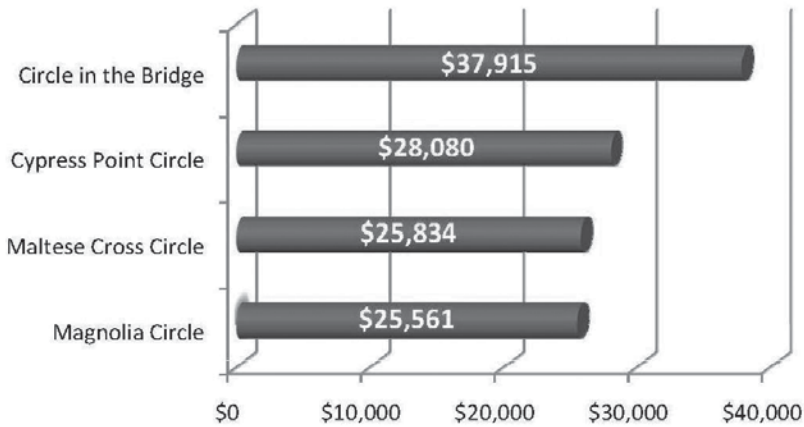
Sandra Jackson and Whitney Quartucci - Congratulations 2011 Award Winners!

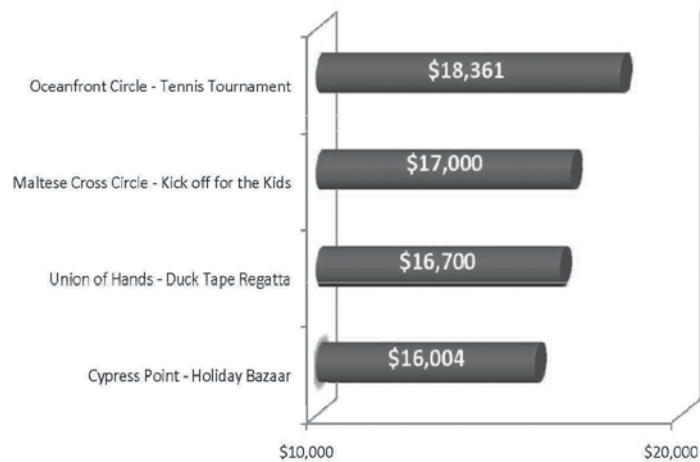
2010-2011 Circle Awards



HIGHEST TOTAL REVENUE

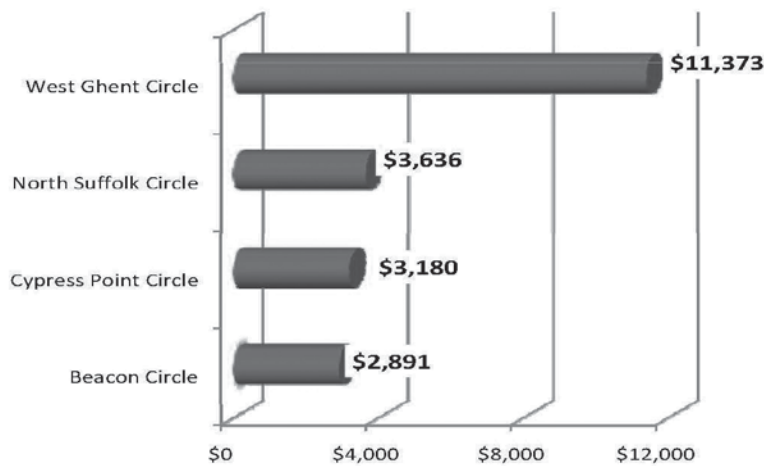


HIGHEST REVENUE FROM A SINGLE PROJECT
