



Children's Hospital of The King's Daughters Health System (CHS) is dedicated exclusively to meeting the unique medical and surgical needs of children, both inpatient and outpatient, throughout Virginia and northeastern North Carolina. Facilities include the Children's Hospital of The King's Daughters as well as a comprehensive network of pediatric providers who work in locations throughout our community.

The King's Daughters' membership is organized into circles (Adult and Junior) that are located throughout Hampton Roads. Each Circle elects its own leaders, organizes its own events, contributes hand-sewn items and donates time and money to CHKD. Members also chair and serve on The King's Daughters' major fundraising projects throughout the year. A Board of Directors which governs the organization is elected annually by the membership and is supported by a dedicated staff.

The King's Daughters' Office



The four-member team consisted of: Lisa Coleman, Executive Director, Jennifer Wilson, Development Assistant, Natalie Carducci, Membership Coordinator and Shelly Williford, Department Secretary. As the year drew to a close, Shelly found her calling working in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit and Sheila Mabaquiao joined us as Administrative Assistant. These ladies worked tirelessly with all King's Daughters current and prospective members, CHKD employees and the community at large, to ensure the continuation of The

King's Daughters' legacy. The King's Daughters' staff were active members of The Downtown 100, Ghent Business Association, Hampton Roads Chamber of Commerce, Association of Fundraising Professionals, Retail Alliance, Volunteer Hampton Roads, Virginia Association of Health Auxiliaries, Hampton Roads Marketing Association, and Volunteers (VAHAV) and American Fund Raising Professionals.

CHKD

The King's Daughters completed our pledges of \$250,000 to the CHKD Virginia Beach Health and Surgery Center and our pledge of \$150,000 toward the purchase of an Aquatic Therapy Pool for CHKD's newest location, the Chesapeake Health Center at



Oakbrooke. A significant portion of our donation to the hospital this year was the first half of a two year pledge totaling \$500,000, to establish The King's Daughters' Donor Milk Bank at CHKD. The annual gift to CHKD totaled \$725,000 for FY 2012-2013. These funds were raised through Circle Projects, Major Projects, Canister Funds and other sources.

Thrift Stores

The King's Daughters continued to support CHKD Thrift Stores through individual donations. The Circle Donation Bag Drive in May generated a total of 3,663 bags full of donations. Each circle collects bags from its members, and totals are tallied. Lakewood Circle was the winner of this year's Bag Drive, 2nd place was Circle in the Bridge, 3rd place was Elizabeth River Circle and East Beach Circle received an honorable mention. Members of The King's Daughters' staff attended the Thrift Store Managers' annual breakfast to show appreciation for their continued promotion of the canisters as well as the incredible daily operations of our thrift stores. The CHKD Thrift Stores have grown from 1 store near the hospital to 26 located from Richmond to North Carolina.

Membership

The King's Daughters are now 1133 members strong with 49 Adult Circles and 6 Junior Circles. Sharing Circle retired after 46 years of service. We welcomed two new Junior Circles: Half Shell Circle and Spark of Light Circle (reactivated). Our 1010 Adult members and 123 Junior members devoted 43,681 hours in the hospital and in the community raising funds, friends and awareness for CHKD.

KD Connect Meetings

Our KD Connect meetings promoted communication among Circles, staff and CHKD. They were held in September, October, January, April, and two in June. Circles presented numerous checks from individual projects and speakers from within CHKD. As an organization we learned the hard way that a quorum is necessary to elect our officers at our joint annual meeting in June.

The 2012-2013 King's Daughters' Recognition Celebration was held on October 23 at the Norfolk Yacht & Country Club. We welcomed special quest speaker Katie Harbison, a King's Daughter, a mother and a patient.

Awards were presented to Circle members, followed by a memorial service for departed King's Daughters. Sherry Connell, McDonald Garden Centers and David Smith, Volunteer; both received The King's Daughters' Award of Excellence which is awarded each year to non-

King's Daughters who show exemplary dedication to our organization.

Circle Accomplishments

Circle projects and revenues again reached an all time high. Over \$304,520 was donated by Circles this year. Donations included 22,068 pieces of linens, knitted items, sewn items, and gifts. Adult Leaders and Treasurers attended orientation and training sessions in Norfolk



and Virginia Beach in September. Circle members continued to arrange tours and meetings within the hospital, inspiring renewed interest, excitement and enthusiasm for CHKD.



Junior Circles

Junior Circles continued to excel. All Junior Circles attended training and orientation meetings in September to help them organize for the year ahead. They held a new fundraiser at Harbor Park during a Tides game "Pitch in for the Kids" was a fun

way to raise funds and introduce The King's Daughters' Junior members to the community. All the Junior Circles working together raised \$3,825 for CHKD.

Corporate Advisory Board

The primary mission of the Corporate Advisory Board (CAB) is to provide insight and recommendations to The King's Daughters that will increase both attendance and revenue for all major fundraising projects, as well as encourage existing and potential corporate partnerships. The CAB assists The King's Daughters in educating the community about CHKD. Sunny Sonner continued as Chair of the Corporate Advisory Board in 2012-2013.

Major Projects

In 2012-2013 The King's Daughters hosted the 50th and final Holly Ball, the 30th and final Holly Festival of Trees. Through these milestone events The King's Daughters raised \$196,000 in support of CHKD's Cardiac Care Program and PICU.







The 9th Annual Tour de Cuisine raised \$27,000 and our banner spring event the 8th Annual RunWalk for the Kids raised \$120,000 in support of CHKD's Donor Milk Bank.

Other Fundraisers, Special Projects and Happenings


In addition to Circle activities and Major Projects, The King's Daughters supported the following special projects:




KD KUDOS

Joann Klotz, Lakewood Circle

Joann Klotz has logged 31,000 hours for CHKD. That's not a typo, we're talking thirty-one THOUSAND hours since joining the Lakewood Circle in the early 1970s. In 1989, she attended a KD Circle Board (now KD Connect) meeting, and heard Mary Lille, the CHKD Volunteer Coordinator, mention that the hospital could use knit caps and booties for their tiniest patients: the premature infants. Joann thought, "I can do that" and started knitting. A consummate sports fan, she knits for the babies at CHKD as she watches college football, basketball and baseball (She's a proud Penn State fan), professional football and even tennis. Those 31,000 hours have yielded 3,975 sets of caps and booties over the years.

This 85-year-old 'energizer bunny' has been an active member of the Lakewood Circle, Norfolk, for 40 years. She served two terms as leader and at least a dozen as treasurer. She hosts the circle in her home and regularly attends circle meetings, where she joins in stuffing and sewing surgery bears.

But Joann does more than support CHKD, watch TV, and knit. She is an avid fan of zoos. She is a docent at the Virginia Zoo where, for over 14 years, she has given walk-abouts in exhibits and has gone to schools with animals to educate children. She is an Animal Ambassador at special events. She cannot get enough of zoos. Although she has visited over twenty, from San Diego to the Bronx, from New Orleans to Chicago, and has the pins to prove it, she would like to visit more.

She also does more than watch sports. She was an avid bowler until she broke her arm

at the lanes two years ago. She was the Senior Olympics Ping Pong Champion in 2003, and she loves bridge. A numismatist (coin collector), she has won thirteen Best in Show plaques at the local and state level and won 1^{st} , 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} place plaques from MANA, the thirteen-state Middle Atlantic Numismatist Association.

Joann is also an active member at First Lutheran Church. She served on the Church Council for six years, she was the financial secretary for two years, was librarian for ten years, was on the visiting committee, headed the memorial committee and volunteered at the reception desk.

Joann is from Pennsylvania. She has an older sister and younger brother. She went to Wilson College, then graduated from Penn State University where she majored in Spanish and
