More children die from suicide

than from cancer, cardiovascular disease, AIDS, birth defects, stroke, pneumonia, influenza, and chronic lung disease combined.



mental health is the most common reason patients age 10 through 17 are admitted to a hospital.

18,260 mental health visits

to CHKD are projected for 2018. Demand for these services has increased by more than 400% since 2015.

Nearly 16% of high school students report having seriously considered suicide, and almost 8% report having attempted suicide at least once in the past 12 months.

CRITERIA AND EXPECTATIONS FOR THE KING'S DAUGHTERS BOARD OF DIRECTORS

A candidate for membership to The King's Daughters Board of Directors should meet the following: **Criteria/Qualifications**:

- Be a member of a King's Daughters Circle for a minimum of two years.
- Have worked on a Major Project or been the Chair of a Circle project or been a Circle Leader.
- May not be an employee of Children's Hospital of The King's Daughters.

Expectations:

- Attend monthly board meetings
- Attend board committee meetings as necessary
- Attend KD Connect meetings (4-5 per year)
- Serve as a liaison to Circles
- Become a hospital tour guide
- Sign a conflict of interest form and confidentiality agreement
- Become educated in the workings of The King's Daughters and the other corporations under the umbrella of the CHKD Health System
- Support CHKD's Annual Giving Campaign
- Support and attend The King's Daughters' Major Projects
- Ability to act as a spokesperson for The King's Daughters
- Possess a demonstrated commitment to community service, support for The King's Daughters mission and values
- Willingness to accept additional duties as assigned by The King's Daughters Board of Directors' President

Please Note:

All KD Board of Directors members:

- May not hold a leadership office in their own Circle or on a Major Project's committee unless approved by The Executive Committee of The King' Daughters Board of Directors
- May not serve as their Circle's representative at KD Connect Meetings
- With the exception of The King's Daughters' President, who is a Class A member of the Children's Health
 System Board and an Executive Committee Member who automatically serves as on the Children's
 Health Foundation Board, a King's Daughters Board Member may serve on a Children's Health System
 affiliate Boards with the approval of the Executive Committee.

Atlantic Circle introduced development hearts to The King's Daughters and the hearts were added to our repertoire of linens items. Developmental Hearts are given to mothers whose newborn infants have been admitted to the Newborn Intensive Care Unit (NICU). The fabric heart is worn against the mother's skin so that the fabric might absorb the scent of the mother. The heart is placed with the baby in the isolette or crib so the mother is always with her child. Atlantic Circle brought us the prototype with the poem and that is history. This past year, The King's Daughters made over 600 development hearts for the tiniest of patients at CHKD.







Betsy and Conoly Phillips have served the Hampton Roads community for more than 50 years, and advocating for the health and well-being of local children has long been a focus of their stewardship. For Betsy, the desire to help children began at the age of 13 when she joined The King's Daughters, and her interest and commitment to CHKD grew over the years.
