





Tackling a Crisis

Seven reasons CHKD is lighting the way to better mental health care for our children.



1 in 5

children in the U.S. has a diagnosable mental health condition.



mental health issues are the most common reason patients age 10 through 17 are admitted to a hospital.



18% of high school students

considered suicide in the past year.



36% of visits to a pediatrician

are for mental health concerns.



Suicide is the second leading cause of death

in youth ages 10-24.



Fewer than 25%

of youth in need of mental health services receive treatment.

Half of all chronic mental illness begins by age 14; three-quarters by age 24.

Despite effective treatment options, there are long delays – sometimes decades – between the first appearance of symptoms and when people get help.

Congrats to Chris Neikirk for her New Position as Chair of CHKD Health System Board

We're proud to have one of our own, a long-time leader and member of The King's Daughters, named as the new chair of the CHKD Health System Board. Chris Neikirk was drawn to join a KD circle – Union of Hands – 20 years ago for many reasons, but this one stands out clearly in her mind: CHKD's commitment to care for all children.

It's a mission that will guide her as the health system enters a transformative stage: Expanding mental health services. "I'm honored to work with the talented members of the board, the dedicated management of the hospital, and all the physicians and nurses who work each day to care for the children of the community," says Chris. "That becomes even more imperative as we seek to close a critical gap in mental health services for children."



Chris has 30 years of experience in nonprofit governance and is currently part owner of Smartmouth Brewing Company, where she oversees community engagement, event planning, and a variety of administrative duties. She has an extensive background in marketing, communications, and launching start-up ventures. She also is passionate about her community, serving on boards of The King's Daughters, the Elizabeth River Trail Foundation, and the Norfolk Commission on the Arts and Humanities.

Chris has volunteered more than 4,500 hours for CHKD, currently as a member of the Dogwood Circle. She chaired the "Around My Hometown" book project that raised nearly \$40,000 for CHKD. One of her favorite activities at CHKD is a weekly distribution of free books to patients. She joined The King's Daughters Board in 2003, and the CHS Board in 2011, when the system expanded its regional footprint with urgent care and surgical care centers throughout Hampton Roads.

Ever wonder how our organization became named "The King's Daughters"?



It all began on January 13, 1886 in New York City when Mrs. Margaret Bottome (Bo-Tome) invited 9 friends to her home to talk about starting a "sisterhood" for service in New York City. Mrs. Bottome was inspired by Dr. Edward Everett Hale who had written a short story called "Ten Times One is Ten."

The story tells of ten people who meet at the funeral of a mutual friend Harry Wadsworth and discover that he had financially helped each of them. They each resolved to follow the example of Wadsworth and to help their friends, neighbors and others in the community. They calculated that if each person they help would in turn lend someone else a hand $(10 \times 1 = 10, 10 \times 10 = 100, etc.)$, the powerful spirit of charity and giving would spread and grow.

The ladies enthusiastically embraced the idea of forming a sisterhood and decided to "borrow" the motto Dr. Hale had written in his story:

Look up and not down Look forward and not back Look out and not in Lend A Hand

They also decided that their group should be called "The King's Daughters" based on Psalm 45:13 "The King's Daughter is all glorious within". It did not take very long for other ladies in other cities to learn about The King's Daughters and their wonderful work. Eliza Scott of Norfolk was one of these ladies. In 1886, she returned from a trip to New York and presented her church group with the idea of starting a Circle in Norfolk to help provide services to indigent mothers and their children. In 1887, 7 more Circles were formed and in 1896, there were a total of 17 Circles.

On April 17, 1896 at the request of Miss Margaret Roper, a devoted member of The King's Daughters, all Circle Leaders met to discuss the forming of The Norfolk City Union of The King's Daughters.
